Editorial

A major event this month will be the General Meeting of EFEO members. This meeting, held every two years, is a significant occasion in the life of the School, allowing all the academic staff from our various Centers in Asia to come together. It also provides the opportunity for discussions and consultations with the administrative personnel and the directorate on current concerns and projects facing the organization. This year our meeting will also be marked by the launch of the ECAF (European Consortium for Asian Field Study), allowing us to meet with a number of our Asian and European colleagues who are coming to Paris especially for this event. The meeting will close with a luncheon where we will have the pleasure of welcoming Georges Condominas, the world-renowned ethnologist, a former corresponding member and faithful friend of the School, who counts many of our members among his disciples. He has recently been named an "Honorary Member" of the EFEO by our Academic Council.

It is with sorrow that we have learned that Professor Long Seam, a close collaborator with our colleagues working in Cambodia, died in Phnom Penh on July 15th, his 72nd birthday. He was the founder in 1994 of the University of Phnom Penh's Institute of Language and Epigraphy, where he trained a generation of excellent young researchers in the reading of ancient Khmer inscriptions and inspired them with his sense of enthusiasm. He leaves among all those who knew him the memory of a profoundly kind person, always happy to meet and help anyone interested in Cambodian epigraphy.
