Pondicherry

Dominic Goodall will present a talk on "Who is Candeśa?" at the Tantric Ritual workshop organized by Professor Shingo Einoo (Tokyo University), Octrober 3<sup>rd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> in Tokyo.

Dominic Goodall will be giving a series of lectures at the EPHE on Sanskrit inscriptions in Cambodia. They will focus at first on inscriptions in "caves," examined in the light of Indian Sanskrit texts. They will take place on alternate Thursdays, October 13<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>, November 10<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup>, and December 8<sup>th</sup> from 3p.m. to 5.30 p.m. in the Maison de l'Asie (4th floor), 22 avenue du Président Wilson, 75116 Paris. He will also hold reading sessions of the Kuttanimata (The Bawd's Counsel) of Dâmodaragupta, a didactic poem of the 8th century. These will take place every Monday from 3.30 to 4.30 p.m. starting on October 17<sup>th</sup> at the Maison de l'Asie (ground-floor lecture room).

### Siem Reap

Christophe Pottier will present the results of recent excavations at the Western Baray at the upcoming international conference "Southeast Asian Cultural Values : Preservation and Promotion," organized by the Asia Research Center, Royal Academy of Cambodia, at Siem Reap, October 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup>.

As part of the archaeological work on the management of the Angkor site led by Christophe Pottier, four restorers from the ceramics conservation laboratory in Phnom Penh, under the direction of Bonnie Baskin, will be working and staying at the Siem Reap Center from October 10<sup>th</sup> to November 5<sup>th</sup>. They will complete the restoration program on a group of ceramics from the Prei Khmeng excavations. This work is co-financed by the FOCK, the EFEO, and private donors.

The Master seminar directed by His Excellency Vann Molyvann, under the aegis of the Fine Arts University and the Royal Cambodian Academy, has just ended at Seam Reap. The EFEO Center lodged sixteen of the participants and hosted the three days of Master courses.
