Louis Gabaude will be visiting Phnom Penh, Siem Reap, and Bangkok from 25 January to 3 February to prepare for the joint traveling workshop of the EFEO and the National Palace Museum in Taipei, to take place during the autumn of 2006.

After the first such meeting, held in Taipei last April, of specialists in the arts of southeast Asia, this second phase will prepare those in charge at the National Palace Museum for the opening of a new museum at Jiayi (in the southern part of Taiwan). Siem Reap

From January 19 to the beginning of February excavations on the Bakong site will be carried out by the Mission Franco-Khmère pour l'Aménagement du Territoire Angkorien (MAFKATA), led by Christophe Pottier. This program, co-financed by the Ministry of Foreign Affaris' National Commission on Overseas Excavations, is an APSARA-EFEO collaboration.

Under the same program, three restorers from the ceramics conservation laboratory at Phnom Penh will be in residence at the Siem Reap Center during January and February to set up a new phase of the restoration work on ceramics excavated last June at Koh Ta Méas. This project continues to be financed jointly by FOKC, the EFEO, the Mission, and private contributors.

In addition, Christophe Pottier will be taking part, until February 15, in the "winter program" of the University of Sydney under the GAP (Greater Angkor Project), a joint APSARA, EFEO, and University of Sydney project.

Christophe Pottier will give a talk on "Les hôpitaux de Jayavarman VII à Angkor: perspectives de recherche" (Jayavarman VII's hospitals at Angkor–research perspectives) at the *congress on the history of medicine in southeast Asia* to be held January 10 to 11 at the Center for Khmer Studies in Siem Reap.
