Editorial

February was marked by the loss of two valued former colleagues: Jean Boulbet died on February 11 and Marie-Antoinette Filatriau on February 26. We honor their memory with these testimonials to their contributions to the EFEO: Jean Marcel Boulbet (member of the EFEO from 1958 to 1991 in Cambodia and Thailand) died on February 11, 2007, at the age of 80, in his home at Patong, on the island of Phuket, in Thailand. He leaves two children, Laure (born in South Vietnam) and Marc-Udom, (born in Phuket). His life work was dedicated to field observation and, through a constant reflection on the theme "man and the forest" to the study of human impact on landscape, with the controlling idea that "Many judgments are fundamentally flawed when conceived from the outside, whereas they will be established in fact when the original setting is taken as the point of departure." Jean Boulbet counts today as one of those scholars who have made the academic reputation of the EFEO and of France. He leaves behind the memory of an unparalleled observer of nature, an indefatigable researcher, a loyal friend, and - for those who came to know him - a man it was a rare privilege to have encountered.

Wednesday, March 7: Sophie Blanchy (CNRS, ethnologist at the Laboratoire d'ethnologie et de sociologie comparative, Paris X, Nanterre) will present a lecture on "L'ethnologue et son terrain, regard rétrospectif sur les Indiens de Madagascar" [The ethnologist and his/her field: a look back at the Indians of Madagascar] as part of the study group on Gujarati Society, Language and Culture, under the direction of Pierre Lachaier (6:00-8:00 p.m., first floor lecture hall).

During March Richard G.
