On April 1<sup>st</sup> Christian Costopoulos, Secretary General, will leave the EFEO to take up the post of Secretary General of the University of Versailles–St. Quentin en Yvelines.

Until April 8 Pierre-Yves Manguin will be on a visit to Southeast Asia to carry out research and meetings. In Thailand he will visited the Khao Sam Kaeo site to work with the archaeological mission associated with his team, directed by Bérénice Bellina and Praon Silapanth. He will collaborated with Louis Gabaude at Chiang Mai on the production of a new Srivijaya bibliography, and investigate at the Chiang Mai library documents dealing with stucco decorative techniques. In Bangkok, he will be meeting with the Dean of the Archaeology Department at Silpakorn University and officials with the Cultural Service at the French Embassy in order to prepare for future collaboration on the establishment of a department dedicated to marine archaeology at that university.

In Indonesia, he will be preparing, with his Indonesian colleagues at the Center for Archaeological Research, for the excavations planned for July at Batujaya, and start on the ceramic study project of a master's student who will accompany him there. At Singapore he will meet with Anthony Reid (Director of the Asia Research Institute) to update the collaborative undertakings of the EFEO with that Institute (the Field School of Archaeology and the Aceh program), and to work with Didier Millet Publishing House on the English edition of *Un siècle pour l'Asie*.

Ravindran, was invited to the Rashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha (RSVP) in Tirupati to train the RSVP's technicians in the digitisation of thier manuscript collection for a period of 4 days.
