In November we are launching the new annual cycle of the "Iena Lectures" (Conférences Iéna), organized jointly by the EFEO and the Guimet National Museum of Asian Art. The general range of these lectures will cover the art, archaeology, and anthropology of Asia. The cycle will begin with a series of lectures entitled "Images and imagination – Buddhism in Asia," exploring new perspectives, offering new insights, and raising new questions on the roles and signification of Buddhist art during its 2,500 years of history in Asia. The lectures, presented by internationally known scholars, will present the most recent results based on investigations in the field and on primary documents.
