Editorial

On the occasion of the EUROSEAS (European Association for South-East Asian Studies) congress to be held in Paris at the beginning of September, the EFEAO will sign the first of several new agreements covering scholarly cooperation with the School in Europe and in Southeast Asia (see below, Paris, September 2). These agreements are intended to strengthen exchanges between the EFEAO network and centers of Asian studies in Leiden and Singapore. In addition to sharing major scholarly resources, the aim is to internationalize still further the research and teaching programs of the EFEAO and to widen the scholarly dissemination of its publications.

On September 2 at the headquarters of the EFEAO an agreement on exchanges and scholarly cooperation between the EFEAO and the International Institute of Asian Studies (IIAS, Leiden) will be signed by Wim Stokhof, director of the IIAS, and Franciscus Verellen, director of the EFEAO.

The 4th congress of the European Association for South-East Asian Studies (EUROSEAS) will be held in Paris from 1 to 4 September 2004. The conference is jointly organized by the French Association for Research on South-East Asia (AFRASE/www.afrase.org) and by the Asia-Europe Foundation (ASEF/www.asef.org), with financial aid from the latter and from all the French organizations interested in research on southeast Asia, including the EFEAO.

Glover (Institute of Archaeology, University College, London), a workshop on "New Data on the Transition to Statehood in Early Southeast Asia" (panel No. 25, September 3 and 4, Descartes Amphitheater, Sorbonne). He will speak on the subject of "Religious networks, merchant networks: God and Mammon in southeast Asian Indianisation?" (September 4, Descartes Amphitheater). Pierre-Yves Manguin will be in London, September 13 to 19, to participate in the 10th international conference of the EASEAA (European Association of South-East Asian Archaeologists), which will take place on the premises of the British Museum. He will present a talk entitled "From early settlement to Buddhist temple complex; New data on Batajuya (West Java, Indonesia)" and will take part in the deliberations of the board of the EASEAA, of which he is a member.
